Imagine: Song Summary

Imagine: Song Analysis

 Analysis = Your group's interpretation of the song lyrics and how it relates to the Vietnam War and the Anti-War Movement of the 1960's and 70's.

Imagine: Song Analysis

Tip #1: Analyze STANZA-BY-STANZA

- Songs that are full of symbolism and metaphors should be analyzed by sections.
- How you organize the analysis is up to you and your partner. You are teaching us what this song means in accordance with Vietnam and/or the Antiwar Movement, so you decide how to structure this information.

 TIP #2: If your song isn't full of symbolism or metaphors...

 Pick out the lines or phrases from the song that are not easily understood or obvious and analyze them here.
